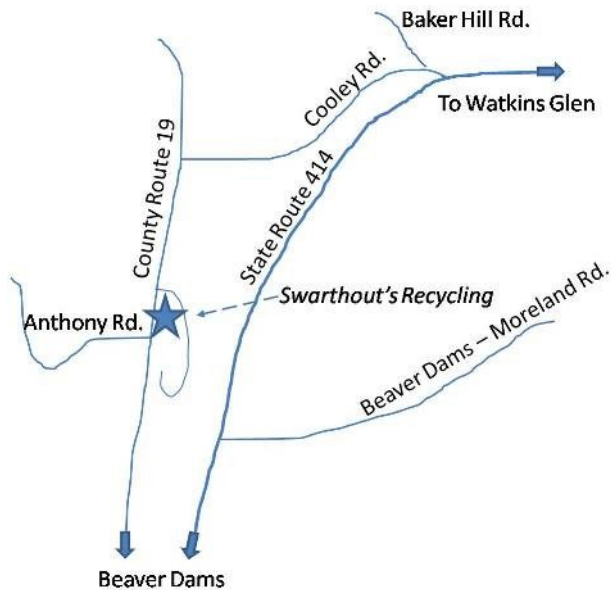
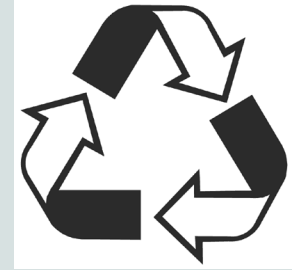

Dix Recycles

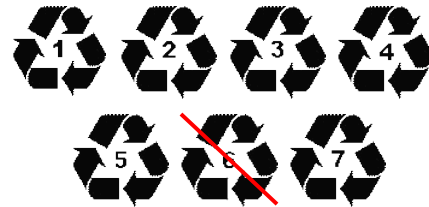
Continuing the effort to lower expenses to the Town, the Dix Town Board has decided to move the recycling center from the Town's Highway premises to Swarthout's Recycling in Beaver Dams effective September first. Initially, only recyclable materials and materials that Swarthout's can currently handle will be accepted. However, the permit process to enable the disposal of rubbish is currently underway. As a consequence, garbage will eventually be accepted for a small fee per bag.

Unlike the single-stream (mixed recyclables) approach used at the Dix Highway facility, the Swarthout facility utilizes a **multi-stream approach, requiring the separation of recyclables by type** (glass, paper, plastics, metals, etc.). Bins, bags, boxes, barrels, and storage chest drawers work well to both store and transfer the materials.

Swarthout's Recycling is open 6 days a week from 7 am to 5 pm. No more waiting to make the runs to the recycling center available only two mornings a month. And, soon you'll be able to dispose of your garbage at the same time!

Recyclable Materials

- Mixed paper: newspapers, junk mail, newspaper inserts, magazines, computer paper, etc.
- Brown paper: bags, package wrapping paper
- Cardboard: (corrugated only)
- Glass bottles & jars: colored or colorless
- Aluminum, tin, steel, copper
- Plastics: (all but No. 6)



Materials must be clean and crushed as appropriate. ***Please separate your recyclables before taking them to the recycling center!***

What not to Recycle

Batteries, light bulbs or tubes, window glass, broken glass, or any ceramic materials. Batteries, TVs, and other electronic devices, paints and solvents, tires, and other hazardous materials may be disposed of during the Schuyler County hazardous waste collection day held in the fall at the County barns off Decatur Street. Styrofoam (No. 6) is not accepted at Swarthout's.
